



Aylesham in Mirro

THE effective closure of Aylesham railway station ticket office and the difficulties this poses for all, but especially disabled travellers, was picked up by the *Daily Mirror* in August. Here is some of what they printed:

he Kent station used to have a full-time ticket office employee, but since Jan retired (everybody knew her by name), she has not been replaced.

Southeastern trains, owned by the Government after it took back the franchise in 2021, says if someone can't buy a ticket at the station, they can buy one from an on-board manager or conductor. Yet in January the £20 fine for being caught without a ticket went up to £100, plus the price of your journey. Worrying.

Apparently, staff will be moved to be out and about on the platforms instead. But it begs the question: why take staff out of ticket offices where the public knows it can find them and instead let them play Where's Wally? How is a visually impaired person supposed to know where a randomly positioned member of staff is?

CONNECTION

How is somebody living with chronic pain, learning disabilities or autism meant to wander around until they find somebody? It's going to leave many people feeling unable to travel. Sue says there was a sense of community at Aylesham when Jan was here. Human connection matters. Mental health has been in crisis since the pandemic and automating ticket offices will make it worse. It is actively disabling.

I'm wondering how I'm going to get across the tracks when I come back to Aylesham. I

can't manage stairs and often use the Passenger Assistance app to book help. But I have to do this two hours before. I also wonder if some disabled people will be able to identify whether people on the platforms are who they say they are.

Southeastern said it is looking into this, adding: "Station help points and CCTV will form part of this process.

The industry consultation on ticket office closures ended on 1 September, having been extended following public pressure.

The RMT trade union looks set to continue calling for the plan to be scrapped with concerns for jobs and passenger safety.

Aylesham Heritage



THIS well-used community resource, run wholly by volunteers, mostly ex-miners and people who have a mining connection in their family.

The centre tells the story of the village since its green field birth in 1927 and of the colliery it was built to serve, Snowdown.

The Aylesham collection is centred on the people of the village. It includes a large collection of school photos dating from the early 30's, and importantly school records from the same period.

Our Heritage Centre has exhaustively researched the men who died at Snowdown Colliery, and have constructed a memorial garden in their memory which can be seen at the Heritage Centre.



See the Beautiful Trees at Fredville Park Nonington

Start your walk on Ratling Road, Aylesham. Head east over the railway line and past the Yodel depot to the crossroads. Go straight across Palm Tree Lane and take the footpath on the corner of Palm Tree Lane and Chapman Hill. Follow the path across two fields.


Coming out on to the road walk down towards St Mary's Church Nonington. The church dates back to the 13th century and is worth a look around if it is open. Go through the churchyard on to the corner of Pinner Lane and Vicarage Street.

On your right have a look in the cemetery where there is a large gravestone headed 'Two Roads'. The gravestone is a memorial to the life of John Payn who died in 1872 aged only 22. It was erected by the vicar of Nonington, Revd. Douglas. It's unclear why but maybe John led a life of questionable morality and the vicar wanted to teach his parishioners a lesson.

From here walk up Vicarage Street and turn into Church Street on your right. Take the footpath on your left in between Nonington primary school and Cornerways House. At the end of the path you will come out on to Holt Street. Cross the road and turn left walking along the pavement past the cricket ground. At the end of the cricket ground turn right past a cottage to the cattle grid into Fredville park. There is a gate at the side of the cattle grid for easier access. Once in the park you will need to keep any dog on a lead as there will be sheep.

Fredville Park has many ancient oak and chestnut trees. I like to stop and look at the trees thinking about how much history they have seen over the years. One of the trees, which unfortunately cannot be seen from the path, is mentioned in the Guinness Book of Records. It is known as the Majesty and is at least 400 years old. It is the largest maiden oak in the country, even larger than any oak in Robin Hood's Sherwood Forest.

Continue along the roadway through the park. At the

top turn left and go through the side gate. Beware there will still be sheep so keep any dog on a lead. Follow the track round until you come to a white gate by the old gatehouse at Frogham. Go through the gate onto Nightingale Lane.

Turn right and continue along the lane until you reach the crossroads. Cross straight over Holt Street onto Butter Street. Walk along Butter Street until you

see Church Street on your right. Here you can either turn left and follow the footpath to Snowdown or carry straight on up Chapman Hill. Continue until you reach the crossroads from where you can walk back to your start point.

The walk is approximately 6 miles and should take just over 2 hours, depending on how many blackberries you eat along the way!

'In My Humble Opinion'

100 Days and counting!

DOVER District Council, the district authority which covers Aylesham, has a new administration in place since May this year. The ruling group comprises the Labour Party councillors, and the Conservatives are now the opposition group. There are some Green Party councillors too. Here, *Cllr.* JAMIE POUT one of the councillors that represents Aylesham, and Deputy Leader of the Council, reports on the first hundred days in office.

CLABOUR'S new administration at Dover District Council (DDC) has been in charge now for just over 100 days. As your newly elected district councillor for the Aylesham, Eythorne and Shepherdswell ward (alongside Cllr Maria Mamjan and Cllr Charles Woodgate), and being an Aylesham resident, I wanted to give an update.

Typically, many plans will have been in place for months, if not years, and a new administration will be forced into seeing through these projects (for example Fastrack is due to complete in Early-2024). So what exactly have the new leaders and cabinet been up to?

Whilst inflation continues to be sky-high, and food inflation even higher, the cost of living for residents in the District remains an issue. A recent Cost of Living plan produced by the new Labour group, with council leader Cllr Kevin Mills explaining "our number one priority since taking control of the Council has been to put in place plans to help the most vulnerable through the cost-of-living crisis." There are many in our village that we know are struggling: those on the lowest incomes; with pre-payment energy meters;

parents and young families; unemployed and universal credit claimants; people in rented accommodation; and underserved populations. Residents of our District are worse off than Kent, on average, and so our plan is to target our efforts towards those who will see the biggest benefit.

The plan includes an £85k community impact grant, will see the council liaising with local organisations such as Bechange to provide targeted support and a new website to provide resources and advice to residents – a centralised catalogue of help.

The 'Summer Getaway', with thousands travelling through the Port of Dover (PoD) to access the continent, means the usual traffic chaos was expected in Dover this year. A plan was drafted for the Toryleadership last year that was shelved in the hope that MP Natalie Elphicke would save the day. This year, as the cabinet member and deputy leader I have publicly criticised Kent Resilience Forum's (KRF) complacency that ultimately sees Dover gridlocked every school holiday. The media campaign, and work with PoD, meant that many more resources were seen across the town - at key junctions such as York Street, Woolcomber Street and Jubilee Way - that largely kept the town moving, with some isolated hotspots at time. KRF seem keen to protect Faversham and Folkestone at all cost, with a general acceptance that Dover and surrounding roads will experience wide spread jams. There's a way to go to ensure Dover is not Kent traffic's sacrificial lamb.

At July's full council meeting, Cllr Kevin Mills responded to a number of public questions highlighting that this council will take the environment and Climate Change much more seriously: we have recruited a Climate Change officer who will "look outwards as well as within" to make major changes in line with the council's Climate commitments, and Cllr Mills also tasked portfolio holder Cllr Sue Beer with appraising the usefulness of the council's Climate Change Project Advisory Group, to "look at the structure and representation" of the group and look towards "a much wider base". We hope to see support for the Climate and Ecology Bill at the next full council meeting: Aylesham

Parish Council supported this bill some time ago.

In a bid to increase public participation in local democracy, cabinet meetings have immediately been moved to the new 6pm slot (rather than during the day under the previous administration). This allows more members of the public to attend and observe meetings, keeping a careful eye on discussions and ensuring members are in check. This also means that cabinet members like myself, who have day jobs like the majority of our residents, can attend meetings more easily. We see this as a positive step for local democracy.

Since the May election, it's become evident that Kent County Council (KCC) are in dire straights: large financial overspends and corresponding budget cuts as well as internal leadership squabbles. The outcome of this is that our front line services used by the district's residents day after day are in grave danger: fighting to keep hold of bus routes for example will soon become the norm. The next service in their sights is Household Waste and Recycling centres - first Richborough near Sandwich was at risk, and now Deal too - as KCC attempt to make £86.3m worth of savings over

the coming year, with more bad news likely to be announced before the end of the year. DDC officers are clear that shortsighted decisions like closing tips, will ultimately cost our council as more people will fly tip - a burden felt by all. But don't worry: KCC are shuffling their cabinet members in an attempt to "focus on the challenges and opportunities facing [KCC]" according to KCC leader, Cllr Roger Gough - nothing to do with a looming leadership contest then!

On a more local level, I have been working alongside our fantastic council officers to maximise what we get from the development in our village. With works going on near to the station, minor issues (dust, lorries and access) have been quickly rectified where residents and officers have kept in constant communication. We have also been awaiting a new sports hall, to be located at Aylesham Welfare Leisure Centre, and so am working with officers and trustees to ensure this happens sooner rather than later.

As always, I will continue to work for, and campaign on behalf of, residents of the village and our ward."




